

Primary School Uniform Guidelines

Catholic Education Wodonga




School uniform is compulsory at CEW schools.

The information within this document is outlined to assist families in ensuring students wear correct uniform at all times.

Correct uniform must be worn in its entirety to and from school, with no additional items worn to, from or at school.

Uniform items, other than shoes and socks, must be purchased from the CEW Uniform Shop (Details adjacent). All CEW uniforms will carry either a school or CEW monogram. All CEW Schools will enforce this policy.

Guidelines

School shoes and socks to be worn with formal uniform

- Shoes must be completely black (upper and sole included); lace-up, strap or buckle.
- Shoes must have a solid, rigid sole; no soft-soled or slipper-like canvas shoes.

Unacceptable: boots, slip-on or ballet shoes, coloured laces, soft-soled or slipper-like canvas shoes



Sports shoes to be worn with sports uniform

- Sports shoes must be lace-up and provide support for the student's ankles and cushioning while running and playing sport.
- × Dunlop volleys are not a suitable sports shoe.



Wearing of sports uniform

Students must not wear their sport uniform on days when they have no physical education. Sport uniform may not be worn for other practical classes unless passed by the School.

Socks

- All socks must be visible above the shoes with no lettering or logos.
- Navy tights are to be worn with the pinafore or long skirt.
- White socks are to be worn with the dress, shorts, pants and sports uniform Alternatively:
- Grey socks can be worn with grey shorts or pants.
- Navy socks can be worn with navy shorts or pants.



Jewellery

- One watch, one set of ear studs or sleepers (no pendant earrings), other piercings must hold a clear retainer.
- \bigcirc One fine-chain necklace with small cross.
- \bigcirc One simple ring.

Unacceptable: bangles or bracelets, except school endorsed wristband.

Guidelines

Hats and sunscreen

- Students must wear a school hat during Terms 1 and 4, or when the UV Index is 3 or above, while outside school buildings during recess, lunchtime and physical education classes.
- The application of sunscreen during the day is recommended.

Hair

- Hair colours should remain within the natural variations of brown, black, red or blonde. Extremes styles including, but not limited to, dreadlocks, spikes, mohawks and rat's tails should be avoided.
- Hair bands, ties and ribbons in white or navy or school colour (sky blue/red/royal blue) may be worn – no flowers.
- Extreme hairstyles will not be tolerated. Whilst CEW recognises that hairstyles are a matter of individual style and taste, adherence to a uniform appearance means that we expect students to keep their hair neat and clean.

In practical classes, hair may need to be tied back or a hair net worn for safety reasons.

Make-up

- Students may wear a light covering of tinted moisturiser/sunscreen that matches their skin tone. Shellac nails must be a plain, natural tone.
- No other make up or coloured nail polish is permitted.

Students not in full uniform

Students not in full uniform should have an explanatory note from parents or guardians

This must be presented to the student's teacher to be signed, to become a Uniform Pass.

Alternatively, a parent or guardian must ring the school between 8.30am and 9.00am to advise the student will be out of uniform. The student's teacher will be notified.

Note: The note is a courtesy to the school to notify them of irregular uniform. If the school has a spare uniform available, it will provide uniform for the day. This is a replaceable item and should be returned to school by the next available school day.

A student out of uniform does not have the right to wear anything they like to school. The expectation is that they will look reasonable and presentable. Denim jeans are **not** suitable.

If there are ongoing issues with uniform, then the school will make contact with home.

Students who continue to fail to meet the uniform policy and requirements may be sent home or removed from classes.
